## Spaxton – a brief introduction

### WELCOME

On behalf of the Spaxton Community, we welcome you to the village and hope that you settle in quickly. We hope that this community information booklet will be helpful to you. It includes contact names and numbers of many of the different clubs and societies within the village, with which you may wish to become involved, along with more practical information, such as which day dustbins should be put out for collection.

Over time things change and we will keep this document up to date on the Websites of the organisations in the Village that host it. Things also change in what residents want to know, and we will amend and develop the booklet on the basis of your feedback. The names and contact details at the back of the document provide you with ready made route to ask for change and development. We will list to all ideas.

Welcome to Spaxton, whether passing through or planning to stay.

Like many another Somerset villages, we have a well documented history and evidence of earlier archaeological remains, and from these we know of the flints in the fields and trackways over the hills which indicate our earliest inhabitants.

We have the remains of a Roman villa with a tessellated pavement – but this is sadly now four feet under ground!

We know of Saxon boundaries from the 9<sup>th</sup> Century, of Saxon field names, Saxon estates within the present parish boundaries and even the name 'Spakr's ton' – which is a Norse settlers farmstead.

Duke William (William the Conqueror) in the Domesday Book of 1086 which he led, we have details of the condition of Spaxton and its estates at that time.

From then onwards we have manorial records – now housed in the Somerset Records Office at Taunton – and church records, which provide details of later clergy and local events. In the 16<sup>th</sup> Century details concerning the lives of local people, their baptisms, marriages and burials are documented in the parish records which are still maintained today.

Until the 1920s much of Spaxton had been part of large estates, the last of these was owned by Lord Taunton and his family, which he sold in 1919. The houses, farms and lands were bought up by individuals and tenants the records of which may be found in the Record Office.

We sit on the edge of Quantock Hills, an area that was the very first Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (ANOB), the Bristol Channel and the wet lands of Sedgemoor and the WWT lands at Steart Marsh.

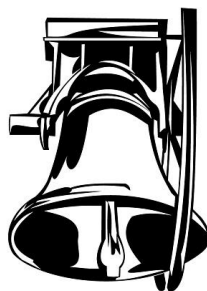
## BELL RINGING

The Village Church, St. Margaret's Church, has six lovely bells and a team (band) of ringers who ring regularly on a Wednesday evening for practice and increasingly on occasions such as church services and weddings.

It is possible to observe the bell-ringing from the body of the church through a big window and observers are always welcome.

## OIL CONSORTIUM

If you use domestic heating oil, you may like to consider joining the Spaxton and District Oil Consortium, which can reduce your costs. Four times a year, John and Liz Knight from Jack O' Knights cottage, compile individual orders for oil into one bulk order and negotiate a reduced price per litre.

Savings vary according to the state of the oil market at the time, but the consortium price is always less than the best you would achieve by placing an individual order and, sometimes, it is substantially cheaper. You will normally need to order at least 500 litres at a time, but the delivery company are flexible as long as it is close to that level.

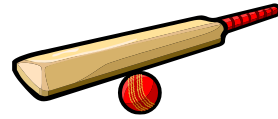
## SPAXTON COMMUNITY NEWS

## SPAXTON, St MARGARET'S CHURCH,



The church building is dedicated to St. Margaret, and may originally have been a simple timber structure next door to the Manor House, which is now known as Court Farm. There is evidence, however, that by Domesday it had become a stone built Norman church. The Church tower was rebuilt in the 15<sup>th</sup> Century and the south aisle added in the 16<sup>th</sup> Century. The Almshouses, now known as Cooke's Cottages were also built in that era. The Church is located a few minutes stroll off the main High Street, down Splatt Lane, which is the road opposite the school. There is a 9.30am service on the first, third and fourth Sundays and a 10am Benefice service on the second Sunday. This Benefice service takes place in each of the six churches

in turn. Regular information about services is put on the church notice board and in the Spaxton Community News.

The Spaxton Community Stores opened in January 2015, and the Post Office counter followed just over a year later. The Spaxton Community Shop Society Ltd. has over 300 shareholders and shares are still available, information on this is in the shop or available from the shop treasurer.

The shop is one of 22 Community Shops in Somerset, with about 350 in the UK overall. These shops are owned by communities and run for their benefit. They provide services which would otherwise have been lost and recycle profits into community projects.

With some justification we consider our Community Stores to one of the best and most successful examples.

The shop sell the goods you would expect to find in a well-stocked local shop, as well as a wide range of local produce. This includes organic vegetables, meats, honey, preserves, bread, cakes, milk, beer and cider. There is a wet fishmonger who visits the shop on Wednesdays from 10 to 11:30 on Wednesdays. The shop has have locally made greeting cards, books by local authors, and maps of local walks. It's impossible to list everything, and the shop will order items that may not be currently stocked if asked. Prescriptions from the two local surgeries can be delivered to the shop to be picked up from there. The shop is also a great source of information, with local services set

out on the notice board. The shop sells newspapers and they can be ordered too.

The Post Office offers all normal Post Office services. These include postal services, cash withdrawals and deposits, banking, travel money, bill payments and phone top-ups.

## SPAXTON PARISH COUNCIL



The Parish Council comprises elected representatives from the villages of Spaxton, Aisholt & Merridge and Charlynch, who work within a small annual budget to maintain basic amenities for local residents. Elections are held every 4 years and meetings are generally held on the first Monday of each month.

The Parish Council offers financial assistance to the Parochial Church Councils towards the upkeep of the cemeteries at Spaxton, Charlynch and Aisholt, and also contributes towards the running costs of both Village Halls.

From time to time they are able to assist with modest community projects, such as the replacement of the seesaw at the children's playing field, and the award of small grants towards local organisations such as the junior football club. Such requests for financial assistance are don through the clerk for consideration at the December meeting, which is when the budget for the following financial year (commencing 1st April) is decided.

In the recent past one or two major projects have been coordinated and partially-funded by the Parish Council, such as the construction of the new footpath along the "S" bend in the High Street, and the purchase of land adjacent to the Village Hall to serve as additional playing field facilities.

The Parish Council's other responsibilities include the maintenance of public footpaths and lending support - or otherwise - to local planning applications.

## SPAXTON VILLAGE HALL

We are a registered charity providing both the village hall and playing fields for people of the village and beyond. The hall was originally built in 1939, and has been improved several times. In 2000 with the help of a generous legacy from a local resident, who was one of the Village Hall Trustees, and grants from local government and the Countryside Agency, and more recently the hall has benefited from the construction of a new entrance and store and an energy efficiency makeover with the addition of photovoltaic panels with the help of grants from Viridor and LARC. The hall is equipped with a large catering kitchen and a modern toilet block with changing facilities for those of you who are keen on energetic sports whether indoors or on the field. There is a modern heating system throughout the building.

We hold a wide range of events, some regular and some occasional. Several groups meet regularly at the hall and there is always scope for a new club or activity. There are two main rooms available, one with a permanent stage and seating for about 120 people, the other will seat 56 people which has splendid open views of the playing field, church and open countryside. Capacity for dances and parties varies according to how tables and chairs are set out and a licensed bar can be arranged if required. You can hire the hall for family celebrations, wedding receptions, or a birthday party when your house just is



not big enough – lots of space for the children to play both indoors and on the playing field weather permitting.

Adjoining the hall are the playing fields which have a range of children's play equipment and there is also a cricket field and football pitch used by our local teams.

The Village Hall also has the defibrillator that we have in the Village.
